COVID-19 CLARK COUNTY DRIVE-THROUGH VACCINATION CLINIC (APPOINTMENT ONLY)

Who: Anyone age 18 and over.*

*Everyone age 16 and over are eligible for a COVID-19 vaccine, but <u>only</u> Pfizer vaccines are approved for those aged 16 and 17.

What: COVID-19 Moderna Vaccines - Administered by Clark County Health Department (CCHD)

When: Thursday, April 22, 2021 - 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM

<u>Please Note:</u> CCHD is transitioning to every other Thursday COVID-19 vaccine clinics. Thus, any <u>tentative</u> 1st dose appointments will be available every other Friday. The next <u>tentative</u> availability for 1st dose appointments will be announced on Friday, April 30, 2021 at 2:00pm. Those <u>tentative</u> 1st dose appointments will be for a Thursday, May 6, 2021 clinic.

Appointments

- If appointment slots are already full, please do not call the CCHD or their local partners. The CCHD is not able to keep waiting lists at this time.
- Please do not arrive more than **<u>15 minutes prior</u>** to your appointment time for safety and traffic concerns.
- Sign up for <u>1 quantity (QTY) per person that would like to receive the vaccine</u>.
 Example: There is a husband and wife coming to the clinic together. Sign up for a QTY of 2.
- Please sign up for a time slot by 3:00pm on the day prior to the drive-through clinic. Those who do not sign up by 3:00pm are not guaranteed a vaccine.

Those who make an appointment: Be prepared to sign-up for an appointment for your 2nd dose <u>EXACTLY</u> 4 weeks later while you receive your 1st dose at the drive-through clinic. You will <u>NOT</u> be guaranteed your 2nd dose if you are unable to make an appointment <u>EXACTLY</u> 4 weeks later. Please consider not signing up for an appointment if you are unavailable exactly 4 weeks later.

Please follow the instructions listed online which includes 4 simple steps.

- 1. Review, complete, and print (if able) the fillable <u>COVID-19 Vaccine Administration Record</u>. (Please consult with your medical provider if needed prior to receiving the vaccine for any questions you may have).
- 2. Review the Moderna Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) Fact Sheet for Recipients
- 3. Review <u>V-Safe Information Handout</u>
- 4. Review FAQ About COVID-19 Vaccination: What Vaccine Recipients Need to Know After Receipt of a COVID-19 Vaccine

Please bring the following items with you to the vaccination clinic.

- 1. Completed COVID-19 Vaccine Administration Record
- 2. For 2nd Dose Individuals: Vaccination Record Card (Hard Copy)

Appointment Reminders

- Please wear clothing that will easily allow the RN's to administer the vaccine (t-shirt or a long sleeve that can be easily rolled to the upper arm to gain access to the deltoid muscle).
- You will be required to wait in your vehicle for 15 minutes post-vaccination for monitoring purposes. EMS will be on-site and assisting with the monitoring. Expect a potential wait time. Thank you in advance for your patience.
- If you are unable to make your appointment due to inclement weather or personal reasons, or arrive after the clinic hours, you will not be guaranteed your dose. You will have to schedule another appointment at a future CCHD COVID-19 vaccine clinic or reach out to your local healthcare provider, pharmacy, etc.
- As a reminder, those who are planning on receiving their second dose of a COVID-19 vaccination must receive it from the same manufacturer. Those who receive the Moderna vaccine must wait 28 days from their first vaccination before receiving a second dose, and those who receive the Pfizer vaccine must wait at least 21 days.

Future Appointments

CCHD may have limited availability at future drive through clinics due to a combination of 2nd dose administration appointments, staffing capacity, and allotted supply of vaccine. Individuals should watch for future press releases regarding new appointment availability.

Those who do not have access to the internet may call the CCHD vaccine appointment line at 715-743-5105, select option 9, then select option 9 again starting Friday afternoons at 2pm. High call volumes are expected. Calling and leaving a message does not guarantee you an appointment. The CCHD encourages those who don't have access to the internet to have a family member or friend monitor online resources.
